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## Revised Scope of the Primary Care Joint Committee

### Background

The decision to redraw CCG and NHS England boundaries was prompted by the clear development of two health systems – one in West, North and East Cumbria and the other in Morecambe Bay (North Lancashire and South Cumbria) – and the need to align these with the NHS planning areas, ‘Sustainability and Transformation Programme’ (STP) footprints.

The boundaries changed on the 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2017 and this has resulted in some contracts and responsibilities in South Cumbria, which are currently managed by NHS England’s Cumbria and North East team, transferring to the Lancashire team. This includes, for the purposes of this committee an additional 32 GP practices transferring from South Cumbria.

The Lancashire NHS England area team has now become NHS England Lancashire & South Cumbria area team. The teams worked closely together to ensure a smooth transition to ensure that partner organisations and contractors will continue to receive the same service and support under the new arrangements. There should be no change to patient services.

### Introduction

This paper seeks to provide an overview of the scope of the Joint Committee in terms of the practices now included in the revised boundary.

### Revised Scope Overview

- General Practice Contracts

In 2016/17 prior to the boundary change there were 10 practices in Lancashire North, 3 holding personal medical services (PMS) contracts and 7 holding general medical services (GMS) contracts, with a combined list size in March 2017 of 158,908.

In 2017/18, post boundary change, 32 practices in South Cumbria joined Lancashire North to form Morecambe Bay. A number of practices merged in Lancaster and Morecambe which resulted in there being 6 practices in the previous Lancashire North boundary area, which now results in a total of 38 practices in Morecambe Bay. Of those 38 practices, 4 hold PMS contracts and 34 hold GMS contracts, with a combined list size of 360,784. There are now 2 large practices, one in Lancaster and one in Morecambe who have merged and are working at scale.

There are two tables in appendix A providing further detail around the individual practices, type of contracts held and list sizes per practice both before and after the boundary change on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017, highlighting the change in scope of the Joint Committee previously and the scope of the committee now.

- Vulnerable Practice and Resilience Schemes
  - Vulnerable Practice Scheme

There are 4 practices identified as vulnerable and receiving funding as part of the vulnerable practice scheme, 2 previously in the Lancashire North area and 2 previously in the South Cumbria area.

- Resilience Scheme

There are 7 practices participating in the resilience scheme and receiving funding as part of this, 1 previously in the Lancashire North area and 6 previously in the South Cumbria area.

### **Care Quality Commission (CQC)**

To provide some further context all practices previously in the Lancashire North boundary area were given an overall rating by CQC of 'good'.

Of the 32 practices previously in the South Cumbria boundary, 29 have had a CQC assessment. 6 were given an overall assessment of 'outstanding' and 23 were given an overall assessment of 'good'. Since then the CQC has contacted NHS England regarding concerns raised about the management of one practice where investigations are ongoing.

### **Future Mergers**

There is an application from the two Garstang practices to merge over the next few months which will further reduce the total number of practices in Morecambe Bay if it is approved.

### **List Closures**

There are currently no practices within Morecambe Bay with lists closed to new patient applications.

### **Primary Care Budget**

The budget in 2016/17 for Lancashire North Co-Commissioning was £20.172m.

The budget in 2017/18 for Morecambe Bay Co-Commissioning is £47.326m (£20,538 for Lancashire North & £26,788 for South Cumbria).

### **Recommendation**

Members of the Morecambe Bay Primary Care Co-commissioning Joint Committee are asked to note the information contained in this paper and the revised scope of this committee.
