<b>Key issues/themes raised by patients and members of the public</b>	The respondent accepts the treatment only gives temporary relief but for that brief period they are able to go out without a wheelchair		
<b>Responses to key issues/themes raised during public engagement</b>	The temporary relief provided by the procedure was one of the reasons it was considered ineffective and therefore, not routinely funded
